Progress report on the implementation of the Soil Thematic Strategy:

- To take stock of what done by EC so far
- To offer an opportunity for a formal response by Council, EP, CoR, EESC
- To be adopted before year end?



Technical document on soil sealing



- One of the deliverables of the Soil Thematic Strategy
- Practical tool for competent authorities and all those involved (architects, civil engineers etc)
- Possible content:
 - Land take and soil sealing within the EU
 - Impact of sealing on soil functions and ecosystem
 - Limit, mitigate, compensate approach
 - Best practice examples
- Expert Group meetings: 23 March, 25 May and 3 October 2011
- Green Week session on 25 May
- Finalisation foreseen at the end of the year or beginning of 2012



EU Strategy for the Danube Region COM(2010) 715, 8.12.2010



- Follows the example of the EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region
- Has the objective of providing an integrated approach to sustainable development
- Contains a specific soil-related indicative target:
 - Reduce by 25% the area affected by soil erosion exceeding
 10 tonnes per hectare by 2020



Further developments-1



Roadmap to a Resource Efficient Europe COM(2011) 571, 20.9.2011

Milestone: By 2020, EU policies take into account their direct and indirect impact on land use in the EU and globally, and the rate of land take is on track with an aim to achieve no net land take by 2050; soil erosion is reduced and the soil organic matter increased, with remedial work on contaminated sites well underway.



Further developments-2



- FAO's Global Soil Partnership including an Inter-governmental Panel on Land and Soil
- Publication of a **study** on SOM fluxes carried out on behalf of the European Commission (next week)
- Study 'Evaluation of expenditure and jobs for addressing soil degradation in Member States, with a focus on contamination' (to be published in 2012-13)

- ❖ Soil remediation conference in cooperation with the office of Saxony in Brussels on 10th November 2011
- ❖ Soil remediation and soil sealing conference in Brussels on 29th-30th May 2012
