By the signing of the "Joint Declaration" on May 17, 1990, in the Wachau (Lower Austria) the Working Community of the Danube Regions was established.

The aim was, and is still today, to give the countries along the danube a strong voice within Europe through a common networked appearance.

The Working Community has therefore adopted this guiding principle:

Promotion of cooperation between its members for development of the danube area to serve the interests of its inhabitants and to foster peaceful cooperation in Europe.

The thematic focal points of the work include:

- Economy, tourism and transport
- Culture, science and education
- Sustainability, Energy and Environment
- Health and Urban Development
