

- no help from the research or extension experts








Simulated Storm Trial



Our Increase

1,300 wheat; 1,000 maize; 1,000 soya; 200 cotton/sorghum/groundnuts



Yield Results

Yields increased immediately & stabilised

MAIZE 4.5t/Ha < 9.5t/Ha

SOYAS 2 t/Ha < 3.5 t/Ha

WHEAT 6 t/Ha < 8 t/Ha

COTTON 2.5 t/Ha < 3.5 t/Ha

Cost Decreased


LAND PREP 75I/Ha > 15I/Ha

DRAUGHT POWER 2 HP/Ha < 2 Ha/HP

Less capital expenditure on machinery, R&M and fuel

Grew 3,500Ha with less total Horse Power than 1,000Ha


