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Soil protection at European level

- Communication of the Commission "Towards a Soil Thematic Strategy" in 2002
- Stakeholder consultation
- Internet Consultation 2005
- Soil protection package (22.9.2006)
 - Thematic strategy for Soil Protection [COM(2006)231]
 - Proposal for a soil framework Directive [COM(2006)232]
 - Impact Assessment



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Soil Framework Directive – Content

Prevention

- Integration in sectoral policies (Art 3)
- Precautionary measures (Art 4)
- Measures to limit or mitigate sealing (Art 5)

Identification

- Identification of priority areas for erosion, organic matter decline, compaction, salinisation, landslides and acidification within 7 years (Art 6)
- Identification of contaminated sites within 7 15 years (Art 10)

Action

- Action Programmes within 9 years (Art 8)
- National Remediation Strategy (Art 14)



Soil Framework Directive – the way through the European Parliament

- Committee on Environment, Public Health and Food Safety (responsible): vote on 9.10.2007
 - Rapporteur: Cristina Gutiérrez-Cortines
- Legal Affairs (opinion): vote on 13.9.2007
 - Rejection of proposal
- European Parliament (Plenary): 1. reading vote on 14.11.2007



Soil Framework Directive – the way through different Presidencies

- Portuguese Presidency (December 2007): no qualified majority in favour of Directive. DE, UK, FR, NL and AT against a Directive
- French Presidency: second half-year 2008
- Czech Presidency: first half-year 2009
- Spanish Presidency: progress report at the Environmental Council meeting on 15 March 2010
 - DE, UK, FR, NL, AT and MT against
 - BE, BG, DK, CY, EL, ES, IT, LU, PT, and SK in favour



Soil Framework Directive – new justification for action at EU-level

According to the European Commission (DG Environment) the following new points justify a European legal act:

- Climate change: impact of land use change
- Soil biodiversity: recent report on soil as "the invisible hero" (February 2010)



Soil Framework Directive – critical remarks (1)

- Soil is one of the most important production factors in agriculture and forestry
- Subsidiarity best way to deal at national / regional level
- Great administrative burden similar to Natura 2000
- Soil is always owned by someone (different to air, wild flora and fauna) - Impact on farm land value in Austria: loss up to 2 billion €



Soil Framework Directive – critical remarks (2)

- In contradiction to decision of European Council: Reduction of administrative cost at 25 %
- No focus on quantitative soil protection
 - Soil sealing: demand of agricultural areas for housing and infrastructure (Germany: 116 ha per day; Austria: 12,1 ha per day)
 - Sealed area is a carbon source: 181-453 t CO₂/ha and year

In favour of European strategy for soil protection however, rejection of European soil Directive
